Dates enclosed in parentheses do not appear on the works. A date followed by a dash and a space indicates that at the time of this exhibition, the work was ongoing, that is, still being printed as demand arises. The term "illustrated book" is used to describe limited edition books containing prints usually executed in traditional printmaking techniques and accompanying a literary text. The term "artist's book" is used to describe inexpensive, commercially printed books conceived and designed by an artist, and often produced in large editions. No technique or printer is cited for artist's books and for mass-circulation magazines, as the mediums are most often those of mechanical reproduction, usually photolithography (offset). Dimensions are given in inches and centimeters, height preceding width for prints and books, and height preceding width preceding depth for three-dimensional objects. Dimensions are not given for multiples that are commonplace objects.
